

# 878 ORPHANS REACHED.

All three of our Camp Hope summer Bible camps have been completed as of last month. We are thrilled to report that 878 children attended and 414 gave their lives to Christ for the first time! Praise God!

Each of the 5-day Bible camps shares the Word of God and the gospel of Christ to around 300 children who are identified by local churches to be orphans or in vulnerable situations. **Two of our three camps were completely Zambian-led this year.** We are grateful for their leadership and vision for the Camp Hope ministry!



Our second Camp Hope of the summer was led by a short-term mission team of 25 Americans in Chongwe, a town just 45 minutes east of Lusaka, the capital of Zambia. Thank you to all who supported these volunteers financially and prayerfully. The team was comprised of people from five different cities, so it was amazing to see everyone come together in unity for the cause of the orphan.

The children were placed in different groups led by a short-term missionary and translator, and they participated in games, crafts, worship, prayer, and Bible story lessons and skits each day. **Please** pray that the seeds sown at camp will continue to grow in the years to come.


# SPONSORSHIP: 26 Suitcases of Gifts Delivered

Bicycles for Humanity collected bicycle donations in April 2016 and filled a 40-foot shipping container (that would eventually become the bike shop itself) with bikes, parts, and tools before transporting it to Zambia.

The container arrived in Chongwe in July 2016. Once it arrived, EOH staff and MFH students made necessary preparations for the shop by painting the container, pouring a cement slab, and putting up an awning and signs.

# HOME RENOVATIONS: Completed



The home renovations at all 12 of our My Father's House family homes have officially been completed! The children and mamas are all so pleased with the new updates. When asked what their favorite part about the renovations was, the children said the showers (a nice upgrade from the bathtubs they had before) and the mamas said the kitchens.

The house interiors and exteriors were plastered and painted, ceilings, windows, and door frames were replaced, and structural issues with the porches, clothes-washing basins, wall-fences, and gates were repaired. All of the kitchen cabinets were replaced due to termite damage. Each home also received new counter-tops, sinks, stoves, refrigerators, kitchen tables, and kitchen chairs.

We are so grateful for all who have responded and made financial investments in the renovation project! We know that these updates will provide a comfortable and safe environment for our families.









All of the beds and mattresses were replaced in the bedrooms, the bathrooms received new sinks and toilets, the bathtubs were replaced with ceramic tile showers and flooring, and all of the furniture in the family rooms was replaced (except in C7 and C8, the most recently built homes).
