The newly updated Handbook is just one of the changes coming to White Cross volunteers across North America. Another change many are experiencing is through the WMF (it comes with various titles such as: Women's Missionary Fellowship). We regularly hear reports that WMF groups are changing. Some are being absorbed into larger bodies like Missions and Outreach programs. Some are reconfiguring themselves internally and sometimes changing their names. Some are disbanding for various reasons. Some are continuing strong as they have in the past.

Change is always difficult. However, before talking about these changes, I want to take a moment to recognize the work that WMF groups have done and continue to do for the work of White Cross: without the work and efforts of the WMF groups, there is no way that White Cross would have made the impact it has in West Africa. In fact without them, White Cross may not have even existed. Remember to thank those who have served for many years!



Change is always happening in our world and in our churches. There was a time when WMF groups did not exist and there may be a time when they no longer exist in our churches. If you are experiencing or seeing such changes, take heart: it is the nature of ministry. It never stays the same. Yet its core never really changes.

In some places, where WMF groups once supported and built up the work of White Cross, we are seeing new groups and organizations continuing the amazing work. Many of these groups are incorporating new members, even men! Of course, the core still is (and may always be) women. We encourage women's groups to continue to fellowship together and do the work of the kingdom whatever their name. We also encourage groups to be creative in finding new and different ways to include others in their work and fellowship. Churches, thank you for encouraging and supporting your White Cross groups!



Overall, the work of White Cross is expanding across the continent. Keep up the good work and encourage each other in whatever ministry you are doing!
