What began as a journey that some doubted would include a return trip ignited a firestorm of faith. Our early missionaries would be amazed at how their efforts triggered events that resulted in Kingdom impact across the entire country of Cameroon. Today, we are all tasked with sharing God's love and our faith in Him with the people God puts in our path. And like the early missionaries, we may never know this side of heaven the impact our actions are having now or in the future.

A simple health clinic . . . and now the Cameroon Baptist Convention (CBC) operates 16 hospitals, 26 integrated health centres, and 52 primary health centres.

A grass roof school . . . and now over 150 primary schools, 14 secondary schools, one seminary with 2 campuses, and thousands of lives changed as a result.

A small prayer gathering . . . and now over 1,500 CBC churches.

A few faithful missionaries . . . and now 60 CBC National Missionaries.



The CBC missionaries gathered for their annual retreat April 13–16. This time of training and encouragement under the theme of Living Out the Peace of God was met with enthusiasm by the missionaries. These pastors serve in rural and remote areas and are also reaching out to least-reached people groups. NAB has been coming alongside these missionaries through the Assist a National Missionary



Project and have provided Bibles, motorcycles and lifejackets.



Motorcycles have made a significant difference – enabling missionaries to travel farther and share the Good News in more villages. Without them, missionaries must walk long distances or wait for motorcycle taxis with unpredictable availability and high transport costs, limiting how many communities they can reach. Recently, Pastor Jumbuin received a motorcycle. He has planted four churches in the East Region, and this motorcycle will make it easier for him to visit these churches and additional preaching points. With at least five containers a year, you can imagine there are a lot of logistics to consider, as well as a constant evaluation of what items are needed or of high priority to source. Our discussions help us discover how White Cross can best assist the CBC.

- Doctors – internal medicine specialists, anesthesiologists, pathologists, surgeons, and general medicine.
- Operating room nurse – to teach a perioperative course.
- Physiotherapists – interested in teaching.
- Pastors – interested in least-reached people groups.
- Teachers – for middle school and high school at Rain Forest International School (rfis.org).
